



Building History

The Rest House, designed by architect Masuda Kiyoshi, was built in 1929 as the Taisho-ya Kimono Shop. On August 6, 1945, the atomic bomb burst in mid-air about 170 meters northeast of the building, burning it out completely. However, as it was built of reinforced concrete, the shape of the building remained. Repairs began early in the year after the bombing, and the building was functional once again. Then, in 1957, it was bought by the City of Hiroshima to be used as headquarters for recovery efforts for the eastern part of the city. The building was renovated to become the Rest House in 1982, and beginning in 2018, it once again underwent renovation to become the Rest House that you see today.

Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park

The Rest House is the only building remaining in Peace Memorial Park that showcases what the former Nakajima District was like before the atomic bombing. Upholding its historical characteristics, the building was renovated to preserve and utilize it as a place that conveys the realities of the bombing and shares the will for peace, as well as to improve the quality of hospitality offered to our quests in Peace Memorial Park. As a building that survived the atomic bombing, the Rest House carries an important legacy. In July 2020, it was reopened with a renovated interior and facade that recreates the way it looked at the time of construction.



Conveying History and Culture (Exhibit Room and Multipurpose Room)



The exhibit room is home to four exhibits about the former Nakajima District. You can also find a large-scale diorama in the center of the room, as well as photos and more that offer a glimpse into the progression of the Nakajima District and the history of the Rest House.


